

# The Renaissance Performance Sport Trifecta Do you have a Renaissance Dog?

All dogs are invited to participate in the Renaissance Performance Sport Trifecta, a special titling event offered jointly by All Dogs Parkour (ADP), Cyber Rally-O (CRO), and Poised for Success Freestyle (PFSF). This event was created in 2024 to honor the Summer Olympics.

**Who Can Play:** It is the policy of ADP, CRO, and PFSF to exclude no one. Dogs with disabilities are welcome and many already have titled in one or more of these venues. While these three Trifecta sports are generally considered dog sports, other animals are also welcome to join the fun.

**Title Requirements:** To earn the Renaissance Dog Trifecta (RDT) title, participating teams must

- Earn one title in All Dogs Parkour.
- Earn one title in Cyber Rally-O.
- Earn one title in Poised for Success Freestyle.

Title entries must be submitted during the event dates (June 1, 2025 through August 31, 2025). If you have already earned legs toward a title, and finish that title within the event dates, that title counts toward your Renaissance Dog Trifecta Title.

#### New for 2025! Two new levels of RDT Titles!

For teams wanting more Renaissance Dog Trifecta, two additional RDT titles are available this year in the following order

RDT-Excellent (RDT-Ex) and RDT-Extraordinaire (RDT-Ext).

Similar to the RDT title, each of these upper level RDT titles requires three additional new titles - one in ADP, one in CRO, and one in PFS. Entries must be submitted during the event dates (June 1, 2025 - August 31, 2025).

#### Where to Start?

All dogs new to the Trifecta begin with the RDT title.

If your team earned the RDT title in 2024, in recognition of your previous accomplishment, you may begin submitting entries toward the RDT-Excellent title right away. This is optional. You may instead choose to begin with the RDT title in order to collect this year's RDT title ribbon.

#### Also New for 2025 - Trifecta Team Titles!

For handlers living with multiple animals, we are offering a team titling option for the upper level RDT titles (RDT-Excellent and RDT-Extraordinaire). Handlers living with multiple animals may declare two animals who have earned the RDT title as a "team" and then combine entries for the RDT-Excellent and RDT-Extraordinaire titles.

For example, a handler lives with two dogs, Jack and Jill, each of whom has earned an RDT title. The handler may declare Jack and Jill as a Trifecta team and then may submit an entry with Jack to

earn, for example, the required ADP title, and submit entries with Jill to earn, for example, the required CRO and PFS titles. Then, their upper level title is awarded to the RDT Team of "Handler and Jack and Jill".

For the Trifecta Team option, the handler may enter any combination(s) of any two of their animals as long as each animal on an RDT-Excellent team holds an RDT title, and each animal on an RDT-Extraordinaire team holds an RDT-EX title.

**Beginner, Single-Q Titles in ADP, CRO, and PFSF:** Each venue has beginner titling opportunities that only require a single Q for the title.

The beginner titles are designed to be done at home in small spaces. They are easily attainable by teams with little or no experience in these sports. Your dog likely already knows many of the behaviors needed for one of the beginner titles in each venue.

All Dogs Parkour offers three levels of Foundation Skills titles, each requiring only a single Q for the title. They may be done in any order. Additionally, only one Q is required for a title in the Theme Track, Ladders Track, and Dozen Track (Theme, Ladders, Dozen, Opposites, and Ingenuity are Special Event tracks. This year, they will be open for entries during the entire Trifecta event.) New teams must start with Level 1 for these titles. Last, the Regular Track and Grand Champion Track Level 1 and Level 2 titles only require a single entry for a title. New teams must start with Level 1, Regular Track.

**Cyber Rally-O** offers four levels of Foundation Rally Skills titles, each requiring only a single Q for the title. FRS titles may be earned in any order. CRO Games Division currently offers five games, each with five levels and two tracks. Each level on each track is a single Q title, level 5 is also a Championship title. In Games Division, titles must be earned in order of levels 1-5. CRO Rally Division has five levels and two tracks. Rally titles each require three Qs, but for teams holding an equivalent first level rally title in another venue (such as the AKC

Novice or WCRL Level 1 title), only one Q is required to earn the Level I CRO title.

**Poised for Success Freestyle** offers a set of Etude titles, each requiring only a single Q for the title. Festival of Props and the Rose Cotillion will be offered throughout the duration of the Trifecta. The other beginner titles (Debut and Overture) require more Qs for each title, but both titles are easily attainable by new dogs (Debut) and dogs with basic obedience and/or trick skills (Overture).

Videos of qualifying entries for all single-title options are listed on page 6 under "Sample Entries". For help deciding which titles might best suit your team, ask for help in the appropriate Fb group listed on page 5. Also listed on page 5 are the ADP, CRO and PFS website and email addresses.

**Dates:** The event is open for entries from June 1, 2025 through August 31, 2025.

**Registration:** Dogs must be registered with each organization in order to participate. Registration is free when accompanied by an entry. Entries are \$20 for ADP and CRO and \$15 for PFSF.

**Title Awards:** Dog and handler teams earning the Renaissance Dog Trifecta title will receive a title certificate and an RDT title ribbon.

Dog and handler or Trifecta teams earning the Renaissance Dog Trifecta - Excellent title will receive a title certificate and an RDT-EX title ribbon.

Dog and handler or Trifecta teams earning the Renaissance Dog Trifecta - Extraordinaire title will receive a title certificate and an RDT-EXT title rosette.

**Video Entries:** All entries are by video. Combine your exercise clips into an edited composite or make a playlist on YouTube. If you aren't familiar with video entries, it's easy to learn. Experienced handlers in

the ADP, CRO, and PFSF groups are all happy to help you get started. Video entries ROCK because they fully capture the memories of your accomplishments with your dog.

**Equipment:** Some titles require one or more props which may be a readily available household item (e.g., mat, dog bed, chair, table, book, etc.) or common training prop (platform, pivot pot, cone, etc.). You will not need any specialized equipment to participate.

For All Dogs Parkour, a back clip harness and leash is required if working with environmental features above the dog's elbow height.
