

CYBER RALLY-O MINI DIVISION (updated July 31, 2026)



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GENERAL INFORMATION

CRO MINI DIVISION:

The CRO Mini Division (MD) follows the format of the Foundation Rally Skills Titling Program, the Rally Division, and the Games Division. MD titles are the same as the other CRO titles, but they have different requirements. MD titles will be preceded by "M-" on the title certificates, and they will have separate listings on the Teams With Titles documents.

ELIGIBILITY:

Dogs (and other animals) must be registered with Cyber Rally-O to participate. The [Registration Form](#) is on the CRO website.

Teams may work toward titles in Mini Division while also working toward titles in Rally Division, Games Division, and/or FRS Titling Program.

CRO RULES AND GUIDELINES:

If you are new to CRO, please read the [Rules and Guidelines on the website](#). Except as stated otherwise in this document, all the CRO rules and guidelines apply and entries will be judged accordingly.

ENTRY FEE:

Entry fees are the same as in the CRO Rules and Guidelines. Retries are the same, too (\$10).

ENTRY FORM:

The Entry Form is on the website.

TITLE CRITERIA:

The criteria for MD titles are in the sections below. They are Mini Foundation Rally Skills titles, Mini Rally titles, and Mini Games titles.

REQUESTS FOR TRANSFERS:

Teams with disabilities may request to have their legs/titles in the Rally Division, Games Division, and/or Foundation Rally Skills Titling Program transferred to MD, and count towards their Mini titles. For example, a team with FRS Level 1 and 2 titles may transfer those to MD, then earn the Mini FRS Level 3 and 4 titles to earn the Mini FRS Super Star title. A team working in Level III in the Rally Division can complete the Mini Level III title using legs earned in the Rally Division and can then go on to Mini Level IV and V to earn a Mini Rally Championship title.

If a team with disability has transferred legs/titles to MD and is later able to go back to the other Divisions, they can pick up where they left off in FRS, Rally Division, or Games Division and do not need to redo legs/titles they previously earned.

Transfers are allowed only for teams with disabilities. To request a transfer contact info@cyberrally-o.com.

Mini Division legs and titles cannot be used towards titles in any other Division or the FRS Titling Program.

CERTIFICATES AND RIBBONS:

These are essentially the same as in the other CRO Divisions. Certificates have an "M" preceding the title. Ribbons have a Mini Division ribbon tab.

MINI FOUNDATION RALLY SKILLS

Eligibility:

All registered dogs are eligible. There are no other eligibility requirements.

Titles:

There are four levels and four titles. Teams may complete any or all levels in any order. There are no prerequisites for any level. More than one level may be entered with the same entry form. It is suggested that inexperienced handlers and/or dogs begin with Level 1 and complete each level in order.

Completion of the Mini FRS Level 1 requirements earns the M-CRO-FS1 title.
Completion of the Mini FRS Level 2 requirements earns the M-CRO-FS2 title.
Completion of the Mini FRS Level 3 requirements earns the M-CRO-FS3 title.
Completion of the Mini FRS Level 4 requirements earns the M-CRO-FS4 title.

Completion of all four Mini FRS titles earns the Mini FRS Super Star title, M-CRO-FS-SS.

Performance Requirements and Options:

A. The team performs 7 different exercises from the exercise list for the relevant level. For exercise lists and descriptions along with exercise demos, please refer to the Foundation Rally Skills Titling Program document on the CRO website.

B. The team must perform each exercise safely, skillfully, and with willingness on the dog's part.

C. If exercises are performed in very small spaces, it is acceptable if only the handler's hands are in view. However, if space permits, the handler must be entirely in view. The dog must always be entirely in view for all exercises.

D. At all levels, lures and/or target sticks may be used for cognitively impaired dogs and blind dogs.

MINI RALLY

Eligibility:

All registered dogs are eligible. There are no other eligibility requirements.

Titles:

3 Qs at Level I earns this title: M-CRO-I

3 Qs at Level II earns this title: M-P-CRO-II or M-T-CRO-II

3 Qs at Level III earns this title: M-P-CRO-III or M-T-CRO-III

3 Qs at Level IV earns this title: M-P-CRO-IV or M-T-CRO-IV

3 Qs at Level V earns this title: M-P-CRO-V or M-T-CRO-V

10 Qs at Level I earns this title: M-P-CRO-CH-LI or M-T-CRO-CH-LI

10 Qs at Level II earns this title: M-P-CRO-CH-LII or M-T-CRO-CH-LII

10 Qs at Level III earns this title: M-P-CRO-CH-LIII or M-T-CRO-CH-LIII

10 Qs at Level IV earns this title: M-P-CRO-CH-IV or M-T-CRO-CH-IV

10 Qs at Level V earns this title: M-P-CRO-CH-LV or M-T-CRO-CH-LV

Teams earning a title at all five levels in a Track will also earn a Championship title: M-P-CRO-CH or M-T-CRO-CH.

Teams earning a Championship title in both the Performance and the Traditional Track will also earn a Double Championship title: M-CRO-DCH. Double Championship titles are also awarded for Levels Championship titles in both the Performance and the Traditional Track: M-CRO-DCH(LI), M-CRO-DCH(LII), etc.

The Mini Grand Champion title is for teams who have earned Championship titles at all five levels in a Track (50Qs, 10 from each level): M-P-CRO-GrCH or M-T-CRO-GrCH.

Performance Requirements and Options:

A. The team must perform each exercise safely, skillfully, and with willingness on the dog's part.

B. At all levels, lures and/or target sticks may be used for cognitively impaired dogs and blind dogs.

Course Requirements:

Handlers may use part of a course from the CRO courses on the website or may design their own courses. Course requirements are as follows:

Level I courses must include:

- at least 6 stations
- only Level I exercises
- at least 4 different exercises (not including bonus stations)
- no exercise may be repeated more than once
- no more than 3 bonus stations

Level II courses must include:

- at least 7 stations
- only Level I and II exercises
- at least 5 different exercises (not including bonus stations) of which at least 2 are from Level II
- no exercise may be repeated more than once
- no more than 3 bonus stations
- Performance Track courses must include at least one Transition exercise and at least one exercise performed entirely in the new position.

Level III courses must include:

- at least 8 stations
- only Level I, II, and III exercises
- at least 6 different exercises (not including bonus stations) of which at least 2 are from Level III and at least 2 are from Level II
- no exercise may be repeated more than once
- no more than 3 bonus stations
- Performance Track courses must include at least one Transition exercise and at least one exercise performed entirely in the new position.

Level IV courses must include:

- at least 9 stations
- only Level I, II, III, and IV exercises
- at least 6 different exercises (not including bonus stations) of which at least 2 are from Level IV, at least 2 are from Level III, and at least 1 is from Level II
- no exercise may be repeated more than once
- no more than 3 bonus stations
- Performance Track courses must include at least one Transition ex-

ercise and at least one exercise performed entirely in the new position.

Level V courses must include:

- at least 10 stations

- exercises from all levels

- at least 7 different exercises (not including bonus stations) of which at least 2 are from Level V, at least 2 are from Level IV, and at least 1 from each of Level III and Level II.

- no exercise may be repeated more than once

- no more than 3 bonus stations

Performance Track courses must include at least one Transition exercise and at least one exercise performed entirely in the new position.

In addition, on your entry form provide a pdf of the following two lists:

List #1. For each station, provide the full and correct name of the exercise as given in the Exercise Description documents on the website, and the exercise level and number. Example, “Station 1. Call Front. Finish Circle. Wait. L1-25”. Indicate which stations, if any, are coupled. You may couple more than two stations. Example, “Stations 4, 5, & 6 are coupled.”

List #2. List the different exercises by level so the judge can easily determine if the course meets HCC requirements.

HCCs must be submitted in pdf form as part of your entry. No other formats will be accepted. A course map is NOT required.

Sample HCCs and Demo Videos for Level I and Level II are attached at the end of this document. Handlers should follow this HCC format and are free to use these courses, if desired.

MINI GAMES

Eligibility:

All registered dogs are eligible. There are no other eligibility requirements.

MINI 1-2-3 Ping Pong

Refer to the 1-2-3 Ping Pong guidelines document on the CRO site to see how the game is played. Mini Division titling requirements are different and are explained below. Each title requires a single qualifying entry. On each track (Performance and Traditional), titles must be earned in order, beginning with Level 1. However, entries for multiple levels may be submitted at the same time.

Titles:

M-CRO-L1(Pi)
M-CRO-L2(Pi)
M-CRO-L3(Pi)
M-CRO-L4(Pi)
M-CRO-L5(Pi) and M-CRO-CH(Pi)

Performance Track titles will be preceded by "P-" and Traditional Track titles will be preceded by "T-".

Teams earning a Championship title on both Performance and Traditional tracks will earn a Double Championship title. M-CRO-DCH(Pi).

Requirements and Options:

- A. The team must perform each exercise safely, skillfully, and with willingness on the dog's part.
- B. At all levels, lures and/or target sticks may be used for cognitively impaired dogs and blind dogs.
- C. Each exercise may be repeated one time.
- D. Handlers may choose to use one cone instead of two and will circle (dog, handler, or both) the single cone instead of alternating between two cones.
- E. If desired, teams may eliminate the starting and ending cone turns. They would start by performing the first exercise, then doing the cone turn, then the next two exercises, then the cone turn, and then the last three exercises.
- F. There is no upper time element requirement. The certificate will show a time category ("Fast", "Faster", "Fastest") based on the following table.

LEVEL	FAST	FASTER	FASTEST
1 and 2	more than 95 seconds	95 seconds	75 seconds
3, 4, and 5	more than 115 seconds	115 seconds	95 seconds

Mini Clusters

Refer to the Clusters guidelines document on the CRO site to see how the game is played. Mini Division titling requirements are different and are explained below. Each title requires a single qualifying entry. On each track (Performance and Traditional), titles must be earned in order, beginning with Level 1. However, entries for multiple levels may be submitted at the same time.

Titles:

M-CRO-L1(CI)
M-CRO-L2(CI)
M-CRO-L3(CI)
M-CRO-L4(CI)
M-CRO-L5(CI) and M-CRO-CH(CI)

Performance Track titles will be preceded by “P-” and Traditional Track titles will be preceded by “T-”.

Requirements and Options:

A. The team must perform each exercise safely, skillfully, and with willingness on the dog's part.

B. At all levels, lures and/or target sticks may be used for cognitively impaired dogs and blind dogs.

C. Each exercise may be repeated one time.

D. Each cluster must include a sufficient number of exercises. The requirements for each level are as follows:

Level 1 requires 4 clusters with 2 exercises per cluster

Level 2 requires 3 clusters with 3 exercises per cluster

Level 3 requires 2 clusters with 4 exercises per cluster

Level 4 requires 2 clusters with 5 exercises per cluster

Level 5 requires 2 clusters with 6 exercises per cluster

E. The course may include up to three bonus exercise. Bonus exercises must be clustered, and are performed as an additional cluster after the last required cluster.

Entries may include non-cluster exercises, as needed, to link the clusters together.

Performance Track entries must include at least one Transition exercise which may be part of a cluster or not.

In your entry, be sure to take a couple steps between clusters so the clusters are clearly separated.

MINI Crazy Cones

Refer to the Crazy Cones guidelines document on the CRO site to see how the game is played. Mini Division titling requirements are different and are explained below. Each title requires a single qualifying entry. On each track (Performance and Traditional), titles must be earned in order, beginning with Level 1. However, entries for multiple levels may be submitted at the same time.

Titles:

M-CRO-L1(Cr)
M-CRO-L2(Cr)
M-CRO-L3(Cr)
M-CRO-L4(Cr)
M-CRO-L5(Cr) and M-CRO-CH(Cr)

Performance Track titles will be preceded by "P-" and Traditional Track titles will be preceded by "T-".

Teams earning a Championship title on both Performance and Traditional tracks will earn a Double Championship title. M-CRO-DCH(Cr).

Requirements and Options:

A. The team must perform each exercise safely, skillfully, and with willingness on the dog's part.

B. At all levels, lures and/or target sticks may be used for cognitively impaired dogs and blind dogs.

C. In each entry, the team performs a minimum number of cone exercises and sufficient non-cone exercises to link the cone exercises. All exercises are scored. The exercises may be from any CRO Rally level. The required number of cone exercises in each entry are as follows:

Level 1 requires 3 different cone exercises

Level 2 requires 4 cone exercises, one of which may be repeated

Level 3 requires 5 cone exercises, two of which may be repeated

Level 4 requires 5 cone exercises, one of which may be repeated

Level 5 requires 6 cone exercises, two of which may be repeated

D. In any level, the team may use one cone exercise that is not in the CRO Rally Division descriptions. Examples are a Single Cone Loop (which may be performed by the team or by dog only) or a Dog Only Figure 8.

E. The course may include up to three bonus cone exercises, which may or may not be CRO Rally Division cone exercises.

MINI Points & Positions

Refer to the Points & Positions guidelines document on the CRO site to see how the game is played. Mini Division titling requirements are different and are explained below. Each title requires a single qualifying entry. On each track (Performance and Traditional), titles must be earned in order, beginning with Level 1. However, entries for multiple levels may be submitted at the same time.

Titles:

M-CRO-L1(Po)

M-CRO-L2(Po)

M-CRO-L3(Po)

M-CRO-L4(Po)

M-CRO-L5(Po) and M-CRO-CH(Po)

Performance Track titles will be preceded by "P-" and Traditional Track titles will be preceded by "T-".

Teams earning a Championship title on both Performance and Traditional tracks will earn a Double Championship title. M-CRO-DCH(Po).

Requirements and Options:

A. The team must perform each exercise safely, skillfully, and with willingness on the dog's part.

B. At all levels, lures and/or target sticks may be used for cognitively impaired dogs and blind dogs.

C. Each exercise may be repeated one time.

D. The minimum requirements for each level are as follows:

Level 1: 10 points and 2 different positions

Level 2: 15 points and 2 different positions

Level 3: 15 points and 3 different positions
Level 4: 20 points and 3 different positions
Level 5: 25 points and 4 different positions

E. The course may include up to three bonus exercises. All bonus exercises are performed at the end of the course.

In your entry, please be sure to take a couple steps away from the cone after the Position Cone Turn so the exercise that follows is clearly separated from the Position performance.

Mini Threes

Refer to the Threes guidelines document on the CRO site to see how the game is played. Mini Division titling requirements are different and are explained below. Each title requires a single qualifying entry. On each track (Performance and Traditional), titles must be earned in order, beginning with Level 1. However, entries for multiple levels may be submitted at the same time.

Titles:

M-CRO-L1(Th)
M-CRO-L2(Th)
M-CRO-L3(Th)
M-CRO-L4(Th)
M-CRO-L5(Th) and M-CRO-CH(Th)

Performance Track titles will be preceded by "P-" and Traditional Track titles will be preceded by "T-".

Teams earning a Championship title on both Performance and Traditional tracks will earn a Double Championship title. M-CRO-DCH(Cr).

Requirements and Options:

A. The team must perform each exercise safely, skillfully, and with willingness on the dog's part.

B. At all levels, lures and/or target sticks may be used for cognitively impaired dogs and blind dogs.

C. In each entry, the team performs exercises in sets of three (a "set") with the dog (only the dog) doing a 180 degree turn around a cone between each set of three exercises. The sets of three exercises may be done as coupled stations,

separate stations, or a combination (two coupled, one separate).

D. Each exercise may be repeated one time.

E. Teams with disabilities may have the handler or the dog and handler circle the cone instead of just the dog. In each individual entry, all turns around the cones must be done by the same team member(s) - handler, dog, or both. Different team members may be used in different entries, but not in the same entry. And/or teams with disabilities may eliminate all but two (any two) of the cone turns and, instead, stop and pause before the next set of three.

The requirements for each level are as follows:

Level 1: 2 sets from CRO Rally Level I exercises

Level 2: 2 sets from CRO Rally Level II and 1 set from Level I

Level 3: 1 set from each of CRO Rally Levels I, II, and III

Level 4: 1 set from each of CRO Rally Levels I, II, III, and IV

Level 5: 1 set from each CRO Rally Level
